we have the chance to win over and interest a young audience in our work. The demand for new, high-quality works that can be taken into the repertoire of both small and large stages is growing, as ,Young Opera' is finally being performed at almost all opera houses. When Professor Klaus Zehelein asked me in 2004 whether I was interested in writed a piece for his ,Young Opera' at the Staatsoper Stuttgart I immediately said yes. Meanwhile other pieces have come along, and the openness and enthusiasm of young people for music and experimenting is wonderful – providing that you're telling them a good story.



FUTURE PITCH 2016 is aimed at composers who want to write modern music-theatre works embracing exciting and contemporary themes, who would enjoy experimenting, and have a sense of humour. Our presentation of pieces for young audiences is not interested in ideas such as ,suitable for children' and ,for little ones'. We are looking for people who take their work as seriously as they take the intelligence and perceptiveness of young people between 6 and 16 years old.

The genre ,opera for young audiences' has developed strongly in the past few years and has become very attractive for composers, as opera houses are increasingly demanding more new pieces. The new works are also increasingly judged by aesthetic criteria – and that's where our initiative comes in.

IndieOper e.V. helps to develop new pieces, and to produce and market them. In the Composition Competition FUTURE PITCH 2016, excerpts from new music-theatre compositions are presented <u>publicly</u> to an audience of invited specialists from theatres and publishers as well as an interested public with the aim of leading to a concrete opera production. During the project, composers will be lead into the material by theatrical and musical experts, and supported in their choosing of libretti and in the production of the pieces.

FUTURE PITCH 2016 will be supported by the Karl Schlecht Stiftung and the Baden-Württemberg Stiftung.

SCHEDULE FOR THE COMPOSITION COMPETITION

7th and 8th May 2015 - Public

Introduction to the process and the market for operas for young audiences by specialists from the fields of composition, direction, theatre sciences and education. Including work on small pieces with texts from Wilhelm Busch's *Max and Moritz*, supported by the indieOper team.

Until 15th August 2015 – Application for the Competition

Writing miniatures of c.3 minutes in length for Soprano, Bass, Cello and Percussion.

1st and 2nd October 2015

The *Max and Moritz* miniatures will be rehearsed and <u>publically</u> performed.

The audience, including a school class invited by us, will decide which **three** composers will be awarded €2,500 each to work on a 10-15 minute excerpt of an opera for a young audience.

31th January 2016 - Deadline for scores

From October, the three selected composers will work on their pieces for the pitching. The indieOper team will help in the search for material and libretti, as well as in the development of the pieces. The completed short-versions will be rehearsed by a small ensemble and singers, and then given a concert performance at the pitching. We will invite directors, dramatic advisors, producers and publishers who might be interested in further financing and performing the pieces.

19th March 2016 - Pitching

The three excerpts will be <u>publically</u> performed by a small ensemble. We will invite theatre directors, dramatic advisors, producers and publishers that might be interested in taking the pieces further to their production and performance.
